

Minutes of the Meeting of St Nicholas with Bonvilston Community Council, on Monday 9th January 2023 at 19.00

1. Chair's welcome and introductions

The Chairman welcomed all to the meeting. It was noted that sadly two members of the community passed away over the Christmas period.

2. To receive apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Cllrs Glasson and Halsey.

3. To resolve to declare a member vacancy due to non-attendance of a member for six consecutive months.

Cllr Driscoll has not attended Community Council meetings for six consecutive months and not provided any reasons or apologies for non-attendance – It was **Resolved** to declare a member vacancy – Proposed Cllr Perry, seconded Cllr Rackley.

5. Police Matters

Report received for occurrences in December 2022
