## c. Precept for 2022-23

As a result of the budgeting process, a precept of £55,171 was set. On a tax base of £726, there is a BandD charge of £76 – £1.46 a week. This is about the UK average.

#### 5. Announcements

Mr Howell reported that at a Governors meeting he'd raised problems associated with vehicles waiting for the school obstructing School Lane. Prior to the current one-way system, the traffic was a concern as a danger to children walking through the village. The new system reduces the number of vehicles maneuvering, and the number of children walking to parked cars.
